

Stoma. What Does That Mean?




Stoma = Mouth




For People with Ostomies...


The Key Gap

The need for a broadly applicable tool to help people with ostomies communicate in common social situations



Overall Objective

To produce and iteratively craft a patient-informed health communication guide for people with ostomies





Research Questions


<u>RQ1</u>: What are the most salient social situations that people with ostomies face?

<u>RQ2</u>: What are communication strategies that experienced people with ostomies use in each situation?



Project Population

People with current ostomies (ileostomy, colostomy, or urostomy) agnostic to the disease/reason for ostomy.





Aims

<u>Aim 1:</u> Identify the most salient social situations encountered and communication strategies employed by people with ostomies

<u>Aim 2:</u> Coproduce a health communication guide for people with ostomies for the top social situations encountered



Aim 1: Identify Salient Situations

- Focus Groups/Semi-Structured Interviews of People with Ostomies, Inductive Thematic Analysis
 - Recruited through Social Media, Clinical Practice, and Snowball/Network Sampling
 - Sampled for Age, Sex, Type of Ostomy
 - Target 60 Participants




Aim 1: Identify Salient Strategies






- Assemble an Advisory Board of People with Ostomies (~5 members)
- Iteratively Create Guide Based on Appearance, Readability, Understandability, Actionability
- Conduct ~6 Focus Groups








Construction of Communication Guide

Results:

- 27 Participants
 - 5 countries
 - Ages 18-91 (*M* = 55, *SD* = 18)
- 8 Major Themes/Difficult Situations

Guide Format:

- Problem Solution Format
- Multiple recommendations based on disclosure and difficulty
- Links to real testimonies from real experiences




Organizing Results

Code/Situation:	Example:	Script:
Leaks	At a restaurant with a friend – Low Disclosure	"Would you mind asking the waiter for our check? I need to go to the restroom, and we may need to leave."
Public Restrooms	Asking to jump ahead in line – Medium Disclosure	"I'm sorry to bother you, but would it be possible for me to jump to the front of the line? I'm dealing with a sudden health problem."
Patient-Clinician	Clarifying information – High Disclosure	"I have an ostomy and received a proctocolectomy, so this procedure does not apply to me. Would it be helpful if I told you more about my ostomy?"




Next Steps:



- Focus groups
- Returning and new participants
- Revision, design, distribution



Limitations / Remaining Questions



- Influence of participants who are comfortable and confident speaking about their ostomy
- Lack of discussion surrounding intimate relationships
- Predominately White/Female sample



Conclusion

Managing difficult social situations can be an unexpected burden for people with ostomies. Resources such as communication guides can be helpful to manage these difficulties.
